

Welcome to year 1. We hope you all had a lovely summer break and enjoyed having lots of fun. This term the Teachers in the class are Mrs Welsh and Miss Carr and the TA's are Mrs Wilson and Miss Rizvi.

We are all super excited to have lots of fun and to learn lots of new things this half term.



This half term our English will be linked to our Geography topic of hot and cold places. We will be exploring the story 'Lost and Found' and finding out where different animals come from. We will learn to write a description of various things. We will focus on the use of adjectives, letter formation, full stops, capital letters, finger spaces and using our phonics to spell words.

In maths we will be counting, recognising, ordering and writing numbers up to 20.



In science we will be investigating plants and trees. We will be learning about the different parts of a plant, naming and recognising different garden and wild

plants as well as planting our own plants and observing them as they grow.

Also during science we will be learning about the seasons and how they change throughout the year.



In Geography we will be learning about the world that we live in. Identifying hot and cold countries and where they are located on a map as well as what clothes we would wear if we visited these countries.



In computing we will be learning how to log on to Purple Mash safely and how to keep safe whilst using the internet.
