We participated in a group exercise class for National Fitness Day and have discussed the importance of keeping fit and how this impacts our bodies. We know that doing exercise makes us happy and fills us with energy. Another part of keeping fit is eating healthy and we try to eat 5 portions of different fruit and vegetables each day.



Super Scientists

Year 1 and Year 2 children are working towards achieving the Crest Star Challenge award in science club. They have enjoyed planning and completing a range of enquiries to solve simple problems and answer questions. E.g. Which cans of food roll the furthest? Which materials make the best tea bags? The practical sessions have promoted lots of discussion and provided opportunities for the children to develop their working scientifically skills.



Year 3

Year 3 have done a science experiment where we looked at the hardness of rocks, whether they are permeable (if they absorb water) and if they fizz when acid (vinegar) is added. We tested slate, granite and chalk. Our learning has taught us that slate is a metamorphic rock, granite is an igneous rock and chalk is a sedimentary rock. The findings from our experiment show that chalk fizzes, slate is not permeable which is why it is used on roofs and granite is a very hard rock.
