


Welcome back

The final term of this academic year is upon us—how quick has the time gone?! We hope you enjoyed the half term and were able to participate in the Jubilee celebrations. We have some fantastic things planned this half term for the children, including some feathery visitors...

As a class we will be reading Illustrated Stories of Monsters, Ogres and Giants.



In **English** we will be looking at poetry and descriptions. We will be using the poem 'By Myself' by Eloise Greenfield as inspiration for our independent writing. As part of our poetry unit, children will be looking at rhyming couplets and metaphors. We will also be using the book 'The Storm Whale' to support our descriptive writing nearer the end of term.



In **maths** children will continue looking at halves, wholes and quarters. The children will begin to describe position and turns, look at money and also time.



In **science** our topic for the summer term is Animals including Humans. As part of our topic and to enhance the children's learning, we have organised for some duck eggs to be delivered so that the children can observe and document the process. We hope that once the eggs have hatched we will be able to spend time playing with them and observing them swim in a paddling pool. The eggs will be delivered week commencing 13th June.
