Headteacher Comment

Year 6 children had a World War 1 activity day this week and took part in a variety of workshops throughout the day. This activity is to add depth and inspire the history curriculum. The activity day was attended by both FGA and PCA children together and they had an amazing time learning about the events and conditions during World War 1, as well as collaborating with each other.

To finish the term, Year 4 and 5 visited Broadoak for a performance by Allegro Dance, as well as Year 5 visiting St Mary's church for their termly trip and Y1 to 6 taking part in a fencing workshop. Alongside the many enhancements to the curriculum during the school day we have new enrichment clubs starting after half term. These were sent out this week via the MCAS app and start immediately after the half term break.

We are already at the mid-point of the academic year and Y2 and Y6 are busy working hard to reach the 'expected standard' ready for their SATs in May. Y4 are practising their times tables in preparation for the national Multiplication Check in the summer term. Y1 are continuing with daily phonics lessons to prepare them for their Phonics Screening Checks in June. To support your child in their preparation for these national tests you can help by making sure your child attends on time every day, reads daily (or <u>at least</u> 3x a week), completes their homework, accesses Times Tables Rockstars regularly and takes part in any booster clubs on offer. We are always available if you want any further advice on supporting your child's learning and helping them catch up.

Lastly, thank you to all those parents who attended our EYFS stay and play session on Wednesday, it was a great turnout.
