Science Club

Y6 Science club were very excited to experience using Bunsen burners to burn a range of different salts. They observed the flame change colour when different salts were burnt and discovered that burning magnesium produces a bright white flame. They were taught how to use the equipment safely and learnt the difference between a safety flame and a roaring flame. The children were also given the opportunity to extend their learning about electricity by creating both series and parallel circuits. The children worked collaboratively and impressed staff with their scientific vocabulary and explanations.
