Welcome back! We trust you enjoyed the Easter holidays and had a restful break.

This term we have the Y6 SATs. It is essential children in Y6 are in school every day as we approach the tests as time is very limited. Y6 SATs week is Tues 9th May to Fri 12th May. Children need to be in school every day during SATs week to complete their national assessments and this is the only time they are allowed to take them. Papers will be sent off immediately after the tests take place and results return in July. During this week, Y6 pupils should make sure they are organised and have lots of sleep. They should revise as much as possible using their CGP books and online passwords. We will ask the Y6 children to come in earlier during SATs week to offer them breakfast, give them last minute reminders and calm any nerves.

The results of these tests will be used to inform teacher judgements on whether the pupils are at the expected standards for their age.
