



Uniform Policy

At the Dean Trust we have high expectations of school uniform. We believe that wearing school uniform helps a child identify with the school and their peers. It also has practical and financial advantages. A variety of school logo based items are for sale through our uniform suppliers Petite Modes. Boys

- Dark grey trousers/shorts (summer term only)
- Burgundy logo sweatshirt or cardigan
- White polo shirt
- Black shoes
- All children will be expected to wear black shoes, not boots or trainers. Children not wearing adequate footwear will be asked to wear PE pumps instead.

Girls

- Dark grey skirt/trousers or dress
- Burgundy logo sweatshirt or cardigan
- White polo shirt
- Summer dress (red gingham-in summer term only)
- Black shoes
- All children will be expected to wear black shoes, not boots or trainers. Children not wearing adequate footwear will be asked to wear PE pumps instead.
- Long hair should be tied back. Only plain bobbles are permitted.

PE Kits (Reception only)

Burgundy shorts, white logo T-shirt and black pumps (indoor PE kit).

Trainers, grey jogging bottoms, burgundy sweatshirt, white logo T-shirt (outdoor PE kit)

Jewellery

NO jewellery is permitted. This includes watches and earrings. If worn, children will be asked to remove them. Nail polish/Tattoo transfers are not permitted.

We have high expectations of behaviour and each classroom has a displayed set of rules, agreed with the children, which are referred to regularly (class charter). This is an agreement between staff and pupils on rules and expectations for their classroom. Staff will consistently promote the school values alongside these rules. The school uses these values as themes for the school assembly programme. We believe in clear rules and boundaries whilst recognising and encouraging good behaviour.
